

The Gulf Research Center Kicks off the 10th Annual Gulf Research Meeting at the University of Cambridge

The Gulf Research Center's annual Gulf Research Meeting (GRM) commenced on Monday, July 16 at the University of Cambridge. The Gulf Research Meeting is the largest academic conference that highlights issues of importance to the Gulf region, providing a basis for undertaking and engaging in academic and empirical research in the fields of politics, economics, energy, security and the wider social sciences.

The GRM opening ceremony on July 15 included distinguished speakers such as Professor David Cardwell, Pro-Vice-Chancellor for Strategy and Planning at the University of Cambridge, H.E. Dr. Shaikh Abdulla bin Ahmed Al Khalifa, Chairman of the Board of Trustees at the Bahrain Centre for Strategic, International and Energy Studies (Derasat) and H.E. Dr. Abdullatif bin Rashid Al Zayani, Secretary General of the Cooperation Council for the Arab States of the Gulf. Following the keynote speeches at the ceremony, a panel of experts gathered to discuss political and economic developments in the Gulf countries.

This year's GRM marks the 10th anniversary of the gathering since it was launched in 2010, and this special edition of the event is welcoming over 340 participants coming from over 50 countries, who will present their research papers in a total of 14 workshops from July 16-18.
